LPGA-USGA Girls Golf, a developmental junior golf program for girls ages 7-17, was formed to create a network for girls to learn the game of golf, build friendships and sample competition in a positive and supportive learning environment. The only national initiative of its kind just for girls, the program provides the opportunity to achieve success, progress in golf, and establish a life long interest in the game.

Girls are taught by PGA/LPGA instructors to learn the basics in rules, etiquette, full swing, short game, and putting. The program:

- Helps develop self esteem
- Provides grant opportunities
- Provides an incentive to continue to progress and improve your game
- Creates a network in which girls feel comfortable in golf
- Teaches an appreciation and love for the game of golf because IT'S FUN!

Renaissance Junior Golf, Inc. the parent organization of LPGA-USGA Girls Golf Greater Newark, in partnership with Union County, conducts programs at Galloping Hill Learning Center. Participants are instructed in both golf and Life Skills that will benefit them off and on the course. Each week these principles are reinforced through golf instruction. The classes at Galloping Hill are taught at The Learning Center with 52 stalls, 20 of which are covered and heated, 46,000 square feet of putting and chipping areas, practice bunkers and a 9 hole practice course. The girls are introduced to the game in a setting designed specifically for instruction followed by on course play as their skills improve. On course instruction on the 9 -hole course is available for advanced players as well as a Pitch and Putt league at Ashbrook Golf Course in June and July.
